continent and the life zones of this State, as indicated by vegetation; giving some interesting comparisons from his own collections at widely separated points for genera like *Brachinus* and *Bcmbidium*. The locality at Windsor, N. Y., had proved especially interesting from the mixture of northern and southern forms and the number of new species, 12 out of 423, requiring description.

Mr. Notman's remarks were discussed by Messrs. Angell, Woodruff and Davis.

Mr. Angell recorded finding a *Cicindela sexguttata* at Rattlesnake Creek, the Bronx, New York City, April 25; remarkable for its small size and unusual color.

Mr. Woodruff reported his visit to Washington and conveyed the good wishes of Messrs, Schwarz, Caudell, Aldrich and Barber to our members.
