Two NEW FORMS.-

HEPATICA ACUTILOBA DC., forma plena, f. nov. sepalis numerosissimis albidis.—Michigan: along an abandoned road near Scott's Cave, Mackinac Island, June 24, 1947, J. E. Potzger, no. 10,793 (TYPE in Herb. Gray).

This "double-flowered" form, sent by Professor John E. Potzger, has the stamens and apparently the carpels all changed to white sepals. Professor Potzger writes that several clumps

were noted, all of their flowers of uniform character.

Cornus Rugosa Lam., forma eucycla, f. nov., foliis maturis orbicularibus vel rotundo-obovatis vix apiculatis tenuissimis.—
Nova Scotia: Great Bras d'Or, Iona, Victoria County, August 6, 1946, Edith Scamman, no. 4393 (Type in Herb. Gray.).

Very unusual in its thin mature leaves almost orbicular and with scarcely apiculate tip; typical C. rugosa having the firmer leaves broadly ovate to suborbicular and abruptly pointed.—
