

CORYDALIS FLAVULA IN CONNECTICUT.—I am very glad to put on record the finding of *Corydalis flavula* (Raf.) DC. on the top of Mt. Higby, a long trap range west of Middletown, Connecticut. The few plants observed were growing on a very exposed and rocky patch of ground. The place abounds with the commoner *Corydalis sempervirens*, *Dicentra Cucullaria*, and *Clematis verticillaris*.

Corydalis flavula grows in the southeastern counties of New York, but has not hitherto been taken in Connecticut or even in New England. Thus the Higby station extends the range of the species some fifty or sixty miles eastward.
