

OPINION 810

TURRITELLA KANIERIENSIS G. F. HARRIS, 1897 (GASTROPODA):
DESIGNATION OF A LECTOTYPE UNDER THE PLENARY POWERS

RULING.—(1) Under the plenary powers all designations of type specimen for the nominal species *Turritella kanieriensis* Harris, 1897, made prior to the present Ruling are hereby set aside, and the specimen from Kanieri, now in the New Zealand Geological Survey Collections no. TM 3948, which is figured by Suter (1914, *N.Z. geol. Surv. Pal. Bull.*: pl. 16, fig. 5) is hereby designated to be the lectotype of that species.

(2) The specific name *kanieriensis* G. F. Harris, 1897, as published in the binomen *Turritella kanieriensis*, as defined by the lectotype designated under the plenary powers in (1) above, is hereby placed on the Official List of Specific Names in Zoology with the Name Number 2195.

HISTORY OF THE CASE (Z.N.(S.) 1659)

The present case was submitted to the office of the Commission by J. Marwick, A. W. B. Powell, R. K. Dell and C. A. Fleming in August 1964. The application was sent to the printer on 2 September 1964 and was published on 31 December 1964 in *Bull. zool. Nomencl.* 21 : 447–450. Public Notice of the possible use of the plenary powers in the present case was given in the same part of the *Bulletin* as well as to the other prescribed serial publications (Constitution Art. 12b; *Bull. zool. Nomencl.* 21 : 184). No comment was received.

DECISION OF THE COMMISSION

On 25 October 1966 the Members of the Commission were invited to vote under the Three-Month Rule on Voting Paper (66)59 either for or against the proposals set out in *Bull. zool. Nomencl.* 21 : 449. At the close of the prescribed voting period on 25 January 1967 the state of the voting was as follows:

Affirmative votes—twenty-two (22), received in the following order: China, Holthuis, Vokes, Lemche, Obruchev, Mayr, Brinck, Munroe, do Amaral, Tortonese, Jaczewski, Boschma, Alvarado, Uchida, Sabrosky, Stoll, Bonnet, Kraus, Mertens, Ride, Forest, Evans.

Negative votes—none (0).

Voting Papers not returned—two (2): Hubbs, Simpson.

Commissioner Binder returned a late affirmative vote. Commissioners Holthuis and Ride made their affirmative votes conditional upon the adoption of a more precise wording in the Ruling of the Opinion than that adopted by the applicants in their proposals. The wording of the present Ruling has been based on a suggestion by Dr. Holthuis.
