

BLEWITT'S FLORA OF WATERBURY, CONNECTICUT.¹—The appearance of this work, a well printed and attractively bound volume of 160 pages, is an event of interest to students of the detailed distribution of New England plants. It embodies the results of twenty years' intensive collecting and careful observation on the author's part. Great pains have been taken to insure correctness of determinations, and practically all the records included are based on specimens now in the herbarium of the Connecticut Botanical Society at New Haven or in that of the New England Botanical Club. The work may, then, be accepted as a reliable account of the vascular flora of a typical river-valley in the granitic hill country of southern New England—plus a great variety of introduced plants such as find their way to a manufacturing center like Waterbury. Some of the rarer species occurring in adjoining townships are also included. In all 1394 species, varieties and named forms are listed, with notes as to frequency of occurrence and local habitat and times of flowering and fruiting.—C. A.
