G. OBTUSIFOLIUM L., var. HELLERI (Britt.) Blake. To the stations much farther east add one in BRUNSWICK COUNTY: sandy pine woods, Seward Forest, near Triplett, *Fernald & Lewis*, no. 14,514. See p. 380.

G. OBTUSIFOLIUM, var. MICRADENIUM Weath. Range extended inland to BRUNSWICK COUNTY: dry woods near Rattlesnake Creek, west of Triplett, *Fernald & Lewis*, no. 14,513. See p. 380.

VICIA TETRASPERMA, VAR. TENUISSIMA IN AMERICA.—The common little weed, *Vicia tetrasperma* (L.) Moench, has oblong, round-tipped and merely mucronulate leaflets. The slender-leaved var. *tenuissima* Druce is beginning to appear with us. Its narrowly linear leaflets are attenuate to slender tips. I have examined specimens from Maine, Vermont, Massachusetts, New York and Oregon, all collected within the last half-century.—M. L. FERNALD.
