### OPINION 813

## FAVIPHYLLUM RUGOSUM HALL, 1852 (ANTHOZOA): SUPPRESSION OF GENERIC AND SPECIFIC NAMES UNDER THE PLENARY POWERS

**RULING.**—(1) Under the plenary powers the following names are hereby suppressed for the purposes of the Law of Priority but not for those of the Law of Homonymy:

(a) the generic name Faviphyllum Hall, 1852;

(b) the specific name *rugosum* Hall, 1852, as published in the binomen *Faviphyllum rugosum*.

(2) The generic name *Faviphyllum* Hall, 1852 (as suppressed under the plenary powers in (1)(a) above) is hereby placed on the Official Index of Rejected and Invalid Generic Names in Zoology with the Name Number 1907.

(3) The specific name rugosum Hall, 1852, as published in the binomen Faviphyllum rugosum (as suppressed under the plenary powers in (1)(b) above) is hereby placed on the Official Index of Rejected and Invalid Specific Names in Zoology with the Name Number 882.

### HISTORY OF THE CASE (Z.N.(S.) 1662)

The present case was submitted to the office of the Commission in September 1964 by Dr. William J. Sando. Dr. Sando's application was sent to the printer on 29 September 1964 and was published on 5 April 1965 in *Bull. zool. Nomenel.* 22: 55-56. Public Notice of the possible use of the plenary powers in the present case was given in the same part of the *Bulletin* as well as to the other prescribed serial publications (Constitution Art. 12b; *Bull. zool. Nomencl.* 21: 184). The application was supported by Dr. Edward C. Wilson, Prof. R. L. Langenheim, Jr., and Dr. E. W. Bamber.

# DECISION OF THE COMMISSION

On 25 January 1967 the Members of the Commission were invited to vote under the Three-Month Rule on Voting Paper (67)1 either for or against the proposals set out in *Bull. zool. Nomencl.* 22: 56. At the close of the prescribed voting period on 25 April 1967 the state of the voting was as follows:

Affirmative votes—twenty-one (21), received in the following order: Brinck, Holthuis, China, Mayr, Lemche, Munroe, Boschma, Vokes, Tortonese, Uchida, Sabrosky, Bonnet, Obruchev, Binder, Evans, Mertens, Kraus, Stoll, Forest, Ride, Alvarado.

Negative votes-none (0).

Voting Papers not returned—three (3): Hubbs, Jaczewski, Simpson. Prof. do Amaral returned a late affirmative vote.
