Notes and Observations

OREODYTES SANMARKI SAHLBERG AND AGABUS BIGUTTATUS OLIVIER (COL.: DYTISCIDAE) IN GLAMORGAN. — At the top of the small valley of Gilfach Goch, Mid-Glamorgan is a large tip of coal waste. Out of the bottom flows a very tiny spring which never dries up. This forms a little stream about 1" deep which dampens an area of 10-15 sq. metres. Here in August 1983 I discovered Oreodytes sanmarki Sahlberg swimming in the stream, and Agabus biguttatus Olivier, burrowing under stones. They appear to be new records for Glamorgan. — D. R.
