MYTHIMNA STRAMINEA TR. (SOUTHERN WAINSCOT) AND ENNOMOS FUSCANTARIA HAW. (DUSKY THORN) IN NORTH LANCs., 1977. — In ten years of regularly operating a light trap at Leighton Moss, Silverdale, with a total of 331 species of macrolepidoptera recorded, the first *M. straminea* appeared on 13th August. South (1961, *Moths of the British Isles*, 1:203) mentions it from Silverdale, N. Lancs. in 1958. Another new record is of a male *E. fuscantaria* which appeared on 3rd September, a species very rarely seen in these parts. — J. BRIGGS, Frimley House, Deepdale Close, Slackhead, Beetham, nr.
