

DESCRIPTION OF *MARGINELLA LATERITIA*, n.sp., FROM THE
ANDAMAN ISLANDS.

MARGINELLA (GLABELLA) LATERITIA, n.sp.

M. testa ovato-fusiformi, laevissima, nitidiuseula, solida, spira conica, obtusa, anfraetibus 5, quorum $2\frac{1}{2}$ vel 3 subhyalini, apicales, cæteris perlaeibus, albo-cinereis, anfractu ultimo apud medium late et pallide rufozonato, omnibus spiraliter notulatis et concinne castaneo-maculatis, apertura angusta, oblonga, labro crassiusculo, nitido, hic illie castaneo-zonulato, intus multidenticulato, columella quadriplieata. Long. 6, at. 3·5 mm.

Hab.—Ad insulas Andamanenses.

This particularly interesting little species has no immediate ally in the genus, so far as its pattern of ornamental painting is concerned, if we except *M. picturata*, Nevill, from Mauritius. That, however, is a smaller shell still. The neatly arranged spiral zones and dotting, producing a fanciful resemblance to layers of masonry, suggested the trivial name.
