

Altogether fifty-six species are figured, which with one exception were known forms. The specimens were in Mr. Hanley's own collection, and of these twenty are now in the British Museum, having been given by Mr. Henry Harvey, the present possessor of the collection.

The apparent scarcity and curious form of this work must be my apology for these few remarks.

PARADIONE, N.N., VICE *CHIONELLA*. (*Read 8th January, 1909.*)—
In my Synopsis of the Veneridæ (Proc. U.S. Nat. Mus., 1902, vol. xxvi, p. 351) I adopted the name *Chionella*, Cossmann, 1886, for a section of *Macrocallista*, Meek, 1876. *Chionella*, however, had been previously used by Swainson ("Malacology," 1840, p. 335, note), and I will now substitute for it the name *Paradione*, with the type *Cytherea ovalina*, Deshayes.
