
THE TYPE OF HESPERIA HORUS EDWARDS (LEPIDOPTERA: HESPERIDAE).— Recently H. A. Freeman (1948, Ent. News, 59:203) placed horus in the synonomy of Hesperia metea licinus Edwards. He did not, however, have access to the holotype of horus which is a unique female in the collection of the Museum of Comparative Zoology. Since Freeman based his synonomy of horus upon its facies, which are very unsatisfactory for a proper diagnosis, I felt that further investigation of the matter was warranted. I have now compared the genitalia of horus with those of metea and am convinced that Freeman was quite correct in placing horus as a synonym of metea licinus.
