Dear Dr. Gray

But I find it will take a long time to do this well! So I will delay no longer, but give the names as far as I have gone. Any, or all of these are well worth looking after, I believe, if any opportunity presents. Feeling afraid also that if I wait for

a reply, I may not catch thee before
setting out for thy proposed summer
journey, & supposing that D. Parry
will be requiring some remittance,
I enclose herewith a Draft for
£60. (Fifty of which please pay
over to him, & retain £10 thyself
as a contribution to said journey
expenses.).

Should opportunity present
I should be glad of more plants
or seeds of Lithospermum hirtum
& Silene rotundifolia. Perhaps
the same party who found & sent
the roots of Lith. hirtum before,
can find a few more?

In sending the list which I enclose
I quite understand that the
localities lie 500 & 1000 miles
or more apart! But I send it,
so that if any chance should

occur, it may be taken advantage of.
