My Dear Mr. Watson:

I want some help on *Carex Nova-
Angliae* Schw. I had supposed this name
older than *C. deflexa* Hornem., but in
looking again over Drejer's little "Revisio
Critica Caricium borealium", I am left
in doubt as to the priority of the names,
and I have not the means of finding out
the truth in the matter. On p. 15, Drejer
credits Greenland with *C. deflexa* on
authority of "Hornemann I". Hornemann's
first part appeared in 1821, I believe
(Drejer, 7). On p. 55, however, he
cites "Hornem.! l.c. p. 938", and the last
reference to Hornemann is to his second
part, which appeared in 1837. Can you
find time to look the matter up for me?
My proofs are now hastening on in the
Torrey Memoirs, and I must make the
changes there if any are to be made.
