My dear Gray

see May 6 1850

I wrote last week naming
you descriptions of *M. Wrightii*
Mimosa & *Hoffman* reggie. I
have since compared the other
Leguminosae which is all I have
had time to do - We are to be
from home for near two
months and I have many
things to finish up

79 and 125 (*Dalea pogonathera*)
This must be the plant figured by
Morison as specimen n. 2 of his
D. penicillata, whilst *D. laxiflora*
is certainly the one he figures n. 1.
and describes more especially as
D. penicillata. I am inclined to agree
with you that the two are
distinct

93 is without doubt *D. alopecuroides*,
and all those marked by you as

new are new to me also

95 and 96 both appear to me to be
Eysenhardtia amorphoides, I have
large small and intermediate leaves
forms from various parts of
Mexico and Eysen. Tepana Schreb
must be precisely the same thing
the calyx teeth vary slightly
but the variations do not correspond
with the differences in foliage.

97 must be *Indigofera Lindheimeriana*
Schreb. *denisonii* 21. 46k - it comes
nearest to *I. acut* but the whiteness
of the leaves on both sides the
long spikes etc appear to be sufficient
characters to prove it a distinct species.

103 *Desmodium* - new to me - near *D.*
canonum but quite distinct

109 *Phaseolus retusus* A. N. S.

106 & 107 *Galactia* both new to me

105 *Rhynchosia* sp. new to me different
in inflorescence from all I know
except an unpublished one from
Bacalar Ayres which appears distinct
in foliage & pubescence.

110 *Phaseolus* new to me near *P.*
parviflorus ^{A. N. S.} but with a much larger
pennis flous.

111 *Phaseolus (Drepanopron)* between
P. filiformis A. N. S. Botolph and
P. pedicellatus A. N. S. Aunceller (Rio)

116 *Cercidium* different from
either of the two I have

describe them
