I am imposing on your good nature yet again in sending what is known hereabouts as jasanine. The resemblance is strong enough to warrant any one's speaking so. I have by me only Coulter's Rocky Mt. Botany and I can't seem to place the specimen. I send last year's seed pod and seed. There are several seeds; the flowers are always in pairs and the stamens seem to be far not too unlike garden jasanine.

The *Dasyterion wheleri* are run up thin high blown stalks all over the hills. I wish you could have some out of our own abundance.
