D. Phacelia arcuaria showing the manner they grow from the roots. If this plant is a parasite, it is upon *Oriflamm tomentosum*, as I always find it near that plant. It is too late to collect *Malacothrix Clevelandii*. I have been too unwell this season to do much - I will try to collect more of *Trauseria bipinnatifida*? I would not be surprised if your surmise as to its being *Trauseria tenuifolia* is correct. *Tr. bipinnatifida* grows in the middle of the street in hard ground, under unfavorable circumstances, and may easily be a stunted growth.
