Dear Sir,

By this mail I send you a package of plants collected by me in this country last year. I should have sent the plants before, if I had not felt too unwell to attend to the matter.

I have about come to the conclusion not to send any plants to Mr Percus Watson, nor to Cambridge during your absence. I have sent Mr Watson a considerable number of new and rare plants, and have never received any recognition from him. He has been very generous in acknowledging the labors of the Parish Brothers of San Bernardino, and has done them the justice they deserve. It is not necessary;

that I should have sent to him  
I had no other purpose, unless  
his policy towards me is changed  
I am a small collector

of Grasses & rushes from the County,  
collected in 1851, which I can send  
to some one willing to receive them.
