I was invited by the P.M. at Boston to send for your letter which only came to hand this morning. I am very much obliged for the list and delighted to hear of the proposed dues for Mr. 1st of your contributions. I do sincerely hope you may have time to get it up.

I am writing at my office but will look up Dr. Bigg Palmer - as soon as I go home.

I find that I collected some *Aster Angelica Lyallii* on the Belt Mts., Montana, near the summit of a pass leading to "White Gulch". It was such a big thing that I only got one specimen, now pressed down and in Herbarium, but I can send it on if you think best.

I am so pained to hear of Dr. Gray's accident and sincerely hope that he

may suffer as little as possible and
very soon recover. I will write to him
at once.

Without a label,

I have what I doubt not is No. 319
on a sheet with No. 212. Pary Palmer which
you say is *Cattleya crisphylla*. They are
evidently of the same species and the
1880 plant has the locality "V; in the mu-
tines 24 miles N.E. by N. from Morelia"
"first 6 days Sept. 1880"

I cannot see Ind. lithosp. var. breviflora in
No. 236 nor a *Pithecellobium* in Speci-
men without label - or I will put them
up in such a way that you can easily
return them and will ask you to name
them.
