

New York, 24 July 1846

My dear Doctor -

I thank you for yours of 18th which is
only to hand - I presume you will receive the
imperfect paper, as I mailed it with my letter -
I was not aware that the Epiphytes, arrived on
the day I wrote you, & Sam. sent them forward
at once, by Hairden, to avoid unnecessary
delay - My brother Chas. says they were collected
by the best hand they have at Salwayra, & he
hopes they will turn out worth having -
There are, he is informed 60 plants, but I know
not how many spec. nor (perhaps) did the
Collector of them, himself - This morning I recd.
Engelmann's box, which I forward to your
address by to-day's Boston Boat - after taking
out what I am to send forward, my own
parcel - There were 17 packages in the box,
for which I paid, for express, \$10, & divide
thus - 17 - Packages
1 - for our friend Torrey, which we must frank.
leaving 16 - : 10 :: 11 : \$ 6 : 87 - if my work be
right, your 11 packages come to 6:87 to which
add Cartage to Boston Boat - 31
for you to collect - \$ 7 : 18

My brother's set of P. Lindheimeri is N. 30
 Contg. 125 spec. ch? at \$10. —
 which he has paid to me, with his
 share of carriage, & I remit same to you
 for ac. of Englemann, whom I shall
 advise, pay, your share of charges
 on other side

remaining due to you, in my hands 7.18
 Express to me 2.82 } \$1. — = 8.18.

My brother says he shall be glad to subscribe
 for a set of Bandler's plants, which I see
 are to be \$10 pr 100 — I must wait ^{awhile} _{being too poor}
 Sam. also thanks you for subscribing for
 Hartweg's Californ. Plants for him — I return

you Englemann's letter, & further make you
 a present of my share of the Box! & in
 especial, of the nice barbarium paper, I
 have put in to fill it up, & which came out
 of my own bundle!! — My spec^{ies} were 235
 in number, rather so-so-ish — but they must
 not be chasers — I have no further thing to save
 the Post — Please advise receipt of the Box &
