Dear Sir:

I enclose "Cusick's List of Plants" and the sum of Four Dollars, please send those marked on list by a line at the left of the name, (50. in number which is all I care for of the list). balance if any whatever else you see proper to send. I wish to obtain the new or rarer species whenever possible and avoid the accumulation of a lot of duplicate specimens.

The Enclosed specimen I take to be a form of *Quercus Heterophylla*: with more deeply lobed leaves which have a tendency towards being 3-lobed from or above the middle. The specimen is from a small tree 15. feet in height with fruit, found this season growing in Salem Co.

New Jersey. — I find the Bartram oak this season growing in two new localities in South New Jersey. viz in Salem and Cumberland Counties where its existence was not before known.

It is remarkable that this species should be found growing on each side of the Delaware River only along a line or belt that borders the extreme tidal points of the streams which empty into it in other words, where the Alluvium terminates and the upland commences. Restricted, it seems to be to this narrow range.
