My dear Dr. Gray,

I cannot I think be mistaken
in thinking I owe to your kindness a document
which reached me last week, a correspondence
between Mr. Field & Mr. Loring. How I am
the pleasure of seeing the latter with Mr. Loring,
in Oxford. I remember a very pleasant afternoon
in company with a Mr. & Mrs. Loring. They may
of course not be the same.

I wish I could write fully about the correspondence
which has interested me greatly. I have been
for the last three months well with sciatica
that I am unable to do much writing. There
is so much I would say. I hope I may send
you a letter later on some points. For the
present I must do what I can with my
steady hand and an unclean pen.
In this matter I disagree with Mr. Field &
agree with Mr. Loring in every special
point raised. The one great point in which
I think them both wrong is English feeling
the government & governing classes have
been very anti north. I have ever been con-
vinced that this nation at large has been

The contrary and that the intelligent part
of the working classes had been strongly
the contrary. But then it does not in general
speak and the South do and again we
are carried to a high degree with that free
love: cause of our institutions are everywhere
Drops whose function is to mislead opinion.
I think that the current of opinion below the
surface is slowly working upwards & the
discussion on this or on other great points
of policy between the upper & the lower
strata of society will become daily more
harsh. I have never doubted in my
own opinion. I think a worse cause than
that of the South has never in my age
been fought by a ~~large~~ large body of men.
Stick on the whole as bound together
against the States' good. They ought to be
the aversion of all men, they can suggest
to any at the object of sympathy in the
heart of our democratic upper classes, de-
nounced by their own abuse of power in
Andra & elsewhere and misguided in their
judgment by their dislike of Republican
institutions when they take the Democratic
form. I wish you of the North therefore
most heartily success, to the full extent

a real conquest of your opponents and the con-
sequent extinction of slavery. And I believe
in your power both to, to remove the se-
cession by force. In this belief I find myself
rather isolated. If rightly informed, in this
wise I am at one with the workingmen
in London who wish you well not merely
as against slavery - but as a Republican
power.

In one relation of the thing, I cordially
agree to have the direction of human affairs
rationally conducted it would be a main
reason for the process in whom such
conduct is naturally vested, but in Europe
and in colonial outgrowths, to be spent
for the black race so far as it is
