To day I have sent to your care
for Mr Wheadley a Box of shells, through Messrs
Marsh & Co of Liverpool & in it you will find
a little Box for yourself, they are few in Number
but all that I can send you. *Purpura grandis* Forbes,
is a very rare shell. I have only two in my collection
but I know of one for sale but the price is very high
being £1.10.0.

I have had the pleasure of a visit from
Mr Riise who had the kindness to give me 2 or 3 good
shells from Mexico.

As Mr Wheadley is much absent
from New York I thought it best to send it to your
care as in it I have placed 2 little parcels for Pp
Adams, & one for Dr Goult & I shall feel much
obliged by your causing these things to be
forwarded to them.

I have sent you 2 or 3 Prospectus of the ^{1st} & 2^d Adams' Work. you can shew them to your friends. it will be a highly interesting Work & not much expense - & if any of them would wish to subscribe please to send me their names that I may add them to the already numerous list.

I have not heard from Mr Compton as yet respecting the Remittance which he promised you to send.

I was led to believe when Mr Stuart left England last year that I should have the pleasure of seeing him again here this year. Please to present my kindest regards to him & Mr Stuart & am glad to hear that they are well.
