According to present indications  
there will not be sufficient demand  
for my collections to incite me to

very violent exertion. Therefore I intend not to destroy more than three pairs of shoes this season, just to add gaiety to the revenues of the A.R. & S.S. companies.

Weigl's circulars, of which you sent me two, are, I presume, as good a European advertisement as I could have. I had thought of sending out circulars, but as I got no response from the editor of that Belgian directory, I lack addresses.

I intend to make up a second fasc. of 200. sp. at any rate, I am also collecting material additions to fasc. 1. Of *Dimeria* I have complete specms. to substitute, fl., fr. & nuts. It is an extremely interesting shrub. Have just taken from press *Cabomba*, *Eupatorium tortifolium*, *Poapalum hispidum*, *Hibiscus grandiflorus*, etc.

I intend to start for the coast-day after to-morrow, to be gone two or three days, & hope to find more good spms. of the *Ceilanthes microphylla*. If convenient, please tell me where it has been found before. Also, who are the authorities for two of the names sent me by Mr. Watson, viz., *Vicia floridana* and *Berula angustifolia*.

I would have called the fourth plant *Calophanes hamistrata* but that it is described as having white fls., whereas those of my finding have fls. of the same purplish color as *Anellia oblong.*, *strepens*, &c.
