Mr. Stevens Watson;

Dear Sir - My departure for the Indian River has met with repeated delays, but unless something now unforeseen occurs I shall start to-morrow. I therefore send you an account of my dues at present date. Prof. Ward writes that he has sent you \$25. I hope the others will pay soon & that you will not consider it too much of a tax to receive & deposit the money, & send it all together after my return. I shall probably write to you frequently. Please address me at Titusville, Fla. which will be my base of operations.

I sent you my 2<sup>d</sup> & only specim. of Schoenolobium croceum a few days ago. I find one specim. a year - in rather moist & rich "pine barrens" - in such localities. as suit - Chamaelirium & Amianthium - Am sorry I failed to secure the roots - (See 4<sup>th</sup> page)
