Mr. Watson -

Dear Sir -

Can you

identify the enclosed *Y. alatum* without
much trouble? It grows before my
study window & is said to have come
from Cuba. The enclosed specm.
was sent me from Manatee. The
plant is smooth, in habit like *S.*
Dulcamara, with 7-9-divided leaves
- fls. purplish-blue with yellow center -
fr. said to be scarlet.

There is a singular variation in
Yucca filamentosa which I have
noticed from Fla. to Tenn. Some
plants have a dwarf habit & others send
up an inflorescence 10-12 ft. high - In the
wild state I would place the limits at 3-10 feet.
I incline to think it is a varietal difference, for I
have seen several plants of intermediate habit.
