Your letter  
with the Chevalier doublet was  
duly received. We cannot yet  
to day give a definite answer  
as to the price for which we  
can furnish microscopes, such  
as you describe, and with the  
accessories you mention.

But it seems pretty near  
impossible to furnish them  
with 3 doublets for ten dollars.

We could not furnish the doublet  
alone for less than 2 dollars  
a piece. We will consider the  
matter on all points maturely  
and write you about it again  
the end of this week, when  
we shall also send back your

doublets. They perform pretty well, But it seems, that the lenses we sent with our microscope when screwed all three over one another although not magnifying so much enable you to see more than you could with the highest doublet of the three sent to us.
