We are doing all we can to give the Botany circulation. We sent over 7000 circulars to all the leading schools and teachers of the country. They have already displaced Wood in many first-class schools; the Framingham Normal School ordered a supply a day or two since. The time is

do another season. Our Chicago house
has done finely with them: in several
Colleges in that State, as well as large
Schools, the books have been introduced.
We shall do what we can another season.

and we believe that a work from your pen
properly got up, with your very apt and
