Only we think the real title of the book sh^d be the leading line of the title; so w^d renew our objection to the style of yr printed title. It should begin with a heavy line, "Botany for Young People" and the sub heads in smaller, subordinate type. We hope you will overlook the trouble on occasion you. Our main objection to the title chosen is its length: Botany for Youth w^d be shorter if not better: however, we very gladly defer all to yr better taste.
