Dear Sir;

The enclosed specimens are ~~of a~~ plant which I have found in a large swamp here but which I am unable to find described in your Botany.

It is evidently a Ranunculaceae and allied closely to ^{the} Ranunculus; and bears many marks of Coptis trifolia as also Anemone. It was found growing in mossy ground close to ^{the} water's edge in the woods, and on the bogs ^{also}. I regret not being able to send flowers

I have found none as yet.
It seems to have been
in blossom some time
back. Will you tell me
what it is?

The latitude of Sand Bay is,
48° north nearly.
