

Manchester July 8<sup>th</sup> 1846  
My dear friend I found a  
little from you in care of my son at  
Watertown. According to instructions  
I called upon F. Carey Esq. got the \$10  
When at Taber. Mr. Vasey & I visited the  
Rock banks of the East branch of Fish-  
creek some 3-5 miles above the Indian  
& Meadows where we once botanized to-  
gether. In the crevices of high slate rocks  
we found the two plants I sent you  
in a newspaper from Adams a few  
days after. These plants are new to  
Oncida v. and I think one of them new  
to the State of New York - I sent specimens  
to Dr. Correy at the same time, which he  
only received as I have learned indirectly.  
The day or the next following I inclosed  
the *Horris* in a newspaper - It grows  
on rocks in Watertown and also in damp  
meadows - In the latter places very tall  
say 5-6 feet high - Dr. Craven did

not appear willing to let me send any  
 thing from his neighbourhood but prom-  
 ised to do so himself without fail -  
 We found the *Draba arabizans* in  
 fruit at Sackett's Harbour - He had not  
 seen it before - While we were there Dr  
 Wood & Vasey found a good supply  
 of *Carex Breweri*, Gray. - We also found  
 a good supply of *Dracocephalum pauciflorum*  
 which had not been seen before in 8  
 years, he will send it. I think I  
 obtained the *Carex Bickii* (that with  
 the broad foliaceous bract or scale)

Indeed I send you *Carex Breweri*  
 and *Geranium squarrosa* in young  
 fruit.

Please command any thing  
 in my reach
