

Halifax, 28 July 1865.

Dear Dr. Gray,

Herewith please receive a scrap of *Calluna vulgaris*, taken from a specimen collected in the immediate vicinity of this City of Halifax fifteen years ago. It was given to me by ^{young} lady ^(Miss Lawson) who attended my botanical class this summer. The specimen was preserved in a scrap book along with other Nova Scotian plants collected at

the same time, and the
label reads: "Heath picked
by Georgie at Mount Edward,
August 1850." I enquired
minutely into the history of
the specimen, and feel satisfied
that there is no mistake.
I hope to find the locality,
if the plant has not been
destroyed by clearing, &c.

This ^{new} locality ^{on the Heath} is extremely
interesting, as it ^{tends} ^{comes}
geographically to connect
the Cape Breton ac with
goats in Massachusetts.
