are doing well but *Boehmeria* & *Sabbastina*
we could not get to grow. The Ferns
will be very acceptable also *Cakile* or
Empetrum Conradii which we have never had
and any of your new accessions from
the West or South - any thing in the
Orchidaceous way - any *Cypripediums* &
and *Mitchella repens* which we have all

but lost.

We will not trouble you for *Spigee*
repens, *Linnaea borealis*, *Andromeda*
calyculata, *paniculata*, *polifolia*, or *Rhodora*
Canadensis as we have plenty of them all.
