Dear Sir!

I am much obliged to you for the goodness you have had to forward your Index to me which reached me just at time to use of it regarding synonymy of most species. I have already thanked you for the *Saxifolia* you sent me lately which completed the whole lot of species as reported in your Revision in Proceed. Am. Acad. XI. 118th Since that time I have continued my work. I find a new species in the specimen you sent me lately collected by Parry *Salmaria* in this voyage from "S. donis de Potosi to Sampeco, without name bearing only a number written by you on the label. which perhaps may have some reference to the same number in your herbaria. I have named the same *S. goniocarpum*. I have a great interest that you may easily get acquaintance with these new species as *S. potosanum* n. sp., *S. hemsléyi* n. sp. and *S. goniocarpum*, which are very distinct species and which I don't wonder if you had not looked exactly before as I am sure that they were out of the

boundaries of your Flora. If you have not kept a correspondient number of the Specimens you may look at the new species on the figures which I have annexed to my work. These species are in want of better comparison next to *amabile*'s group. (I do not find *amabile* reported in your Index of course for mistake) these are very far from being so interrelated as those of the *involucratum*'s group.

I have been able now to distinguish
F. aciculare *F. spinulosum* *F. variegatum*
S. ferr. *S. iridatum* *melananthum*
S. polyphyllum (since long time as being
very distinct species) and *F. pini-*
bitatum which is surely the same
as *F. involucratum* -

If you please, a last favour, could
you send me a capitule of *C. barbi-*
gorum var *andrewsii*? I hope that
this will reach in time to give me
some light on the species which I
named under such name and which is
very different from *barbigorum*. and
which I called *F. Griseyi*. My
specimen is collected by Sillyo -

Could you send me at your best
one or two Spurmann with open capsules
of Orobanchaceae of America?

I have 6 species *Obolaria*, but nothing
else, notwithstanding good fruits of some of this
will not give you trouble will be most acceptable.
I am very sorry that my papers didn't
reach you though I had expressly written
to American under Cambridge. I send
two copies of each one for you, the other one
for Professor Gray.
