Dear Sir,

I wish you lucky in the beginning
of this year I think but I have no
answer from you. I fear that this fragment
instead of my letters or else depends from
the ambiguity of the address, of Cambridge
in England, but I use always to write
in S. D. The same thing has happened
perhaps with a letter addressed at the
end of 1874 or about to Mr. Lemmon, I
suppose, because I asked him some
new Triplaris and I have had no
answer from him. Have you any
news from him? I just written to
him the value of his Triplaris some few
dollars and I fear this money didn't reach
to him. In my last letter I promised

to you a copy of Sicilian Plants
now this packet is ready to be shipped
and I hope will soon let you
the steam and the way in which the
packet has been addressed to you
I hope these plants may be useful to you
or if not, I beg you to believe that I have
endeavored to give you such things which
generally are ignored by botanists, and
this in order to show you that I feel
much obliged to you for your kind assistance
in my work on *Siphia*. I give these about
200 "Plantae Siculae rarioris" to you, but
if you have already these species, I give these
to Harvard's University Herbarium or to Prof
C. Gray to whom I feel too much obliged.
My work on Amer *Siphia* lies in my
desk or to speak more exactly is still en-
gaged in our University's members and

have thought proper to include it in the titles
for my women as Libr. Soc. in a volume
which I have already accomplished favorably.
I am anxious to know if you or any
others have published some new *Siphia*,
two species have been perhaps discovered?
I hope you will be so kind to give me
exact notices on these purposes—
If you have some new materials would you
be so kind to give me a specimen of
each new species? My work on *Siphia*
Gerontogea is ready and I hope to get it
ready before the end of this year
I would you lately asking you if
it was possible to sell hundreds of
Sicilian Plants to Amer Botanists, my
plants are the rarest as I collect only
the rare one for the centuries which
bear the title of "Plantae Siculae rarioris"
