My Dear Dr. Oliver

The case announced in
your note of 16 Nov. - that week's
steamer going to New York - is
not yet here, but may be

in London, offers me an oppor-
tunity of sending by his hands

were made many years ago.

cut to be published. They lay
till he died and the specimens
were eaten up by worms. Lately,
Dr. Savage, returning from
Africa, sent the roll to me,
to be published, - which I
declined to do, and told his
friend that these things were
good for nothing in this state,
but would be materials for
you, in your Monograph, &
I advised their being consigned to
you, and said that when
you published you would
render the amplest acknowledg-
ments, - which would evidently
gratify Dr. Savage very
much.

Receiving permission, I sent
the roll accordingly, and
you will see if it is of any
use. I trust it may be -
though it is manifestly out
of the importance which
the worthy man supposed.

I impose upon Dr. Green
also the charge of a box of ~~And~~
Black Walnuts (Iuglans nigra)
which Dr. Hooker wants to grow.

Also a little parcel of speci-
mens for Mr. Kew, which have
accumulated since my last
envoy - put on my part
one of the Compositae - which I
have come upon & described to-
day, will interest you; viz.
my Railardia acaulis, a
Californian Compositae of a
Sandwich Id. type. - a re-
payment to the Continent for
having given to these islands such
Madrid Compositae as Argyroc-
hium & Milkesia.

Dr. Green is familiar with
Kew, where he has experienced
the kindness of the lamented
Sir William. - But he has
not seen the establishment for
years. Without consuming any
of your valuable time, I pray
put him in the way of a pleasant
glance at the gardens & museums
- and oblige both him and I. I am
