

Madrid, Oct. 22, 1880

My dear Watson.

By the time this reaches you, I suppose you will be in Cambridge, & I long to know what you have done. Graduate will give you news of us, and Jackson perhaps more. (*Oxytropis* revised).

A pleasant fortnight at Rupé almost a week in Paris, and then the journey down the Loire to Orléans & Tours, & on to Bourges and Nièvre, stopping only at Burgos. We have had almost a week here, & leave to-night for Toledo, then on to Cordova, Seville, Granada, &c. We have left behind all cold weather, find Madrid even rather too warm than cold. We have enjoyed much.

The Museum here does not help us much; possibly long records among them - around the city might yield a little more but I have done what I could in the time. The types of Carvalilles, Lecocq & this Diss., are mostly here, fairly well preserved & carefully ticketed. Very many things of the - who went everywhere - and a good many of Mocino Herse (only one or two from California & one - a Melanum - said to be from Alaska - but all unnamed) or with unpublished or guessing names. Nothing has been done here, not an American plant named since Carvalilles or perhaps Lagoa. - tho' I can get nothing I need named by him.

I send you a few notes, for preservation, in case my note book is lost. ~~As yet~~
I send only the most important.

Malva minima, Cav. really comes from Buenos Ayres. The wild specimen, clearly same as the pl. H. Matv. 1765, & put with it by Cav. is "a cervo Pampas de Buenos Ayres" was cult. down to 1806, & 1820, & later years. Chile has same. It is the common & rather polymorphous Buenos-Ayres & Chilean species.

Virgilia secundiflora, Cav. is exactly the *Sophora secundiflora* species of Texas.

Cleome viscidulosa, Cav. = the Texas mostly large form, larger than the common Texas - like the figure. - Spec. cult. & a wild one "Hempstead".

Gaura tripetala, Cav. = ours, Texas
not met.

Gaura multijulis, Cav. = a real Gaura, by the fruit, like the plate. The fruit is that of *Gaura corymbosa*. I have never seen it elsewhere.

Adonis Mexicana, Cav. = our plant of Calif. or

A. Virgata, L. Juss. ! Hellier, 1804
1807 = *A. Linaria*, not the one I thought in Syn. Fl.

A. Linaria, Cav. ! yes, in fruit also!

"*Nicotiana sikkimensis*", Wenzl & von No. 178, is the only one in the list. of this set, must be the original of *N. sikkimensis* DC. Prot. V. & is the one I have so called in Pl. VI.

"*Minolia glutinosa*, i.e. *Aster glutinosus*, Cav. is from Rica, Peru. Also H. Matv. 1792; "Mexico" but I doubt Mexico = glutinosa. The other *Minolia* are here.
