

Brussels, May 30, 1887

My Dear Watson.

First, please thank Dr's Goudale and Farrow, each for a welcome letter, and say to the former that I do not understand his beginning "since my last" - this of May 9th is the only one received from him. I shall write one of these days.

I ran over all the Mac. & some of those of Odyss. & Gairdner. No notes that we want to use in Palmer, all to speak of.

344. My Mex. Mexican, looks more much like *M. communis* in plige that it is probably Palmer's.

382. *Claytonia patuloides* = *C. alpicola* var. *rupestris*, Benth. has thick 4 ribs & is *C. sibirica*.

117. *Trientalis polyandra* - I presume not published, from size of flower might be yours with delicate fruit, but ripe fruit not represented.

407. *Randia edimocarpa* is an original drawing (I think there are nearly 200) = Palmer's pl.

258. I hope I am in time

Eupatorium theophrasticum
Dr. Pursh, vi. is the proper

name of the E. (Hebeclimium),
which I thought me, & which I could
not make out at Keen - I sent
some notes about - Perhaps you it
a name of the sp. - Large white
or white leaves & a full eye &
many large heads, glandular - pro-
longed pedicels, &c. &c. -

My Eupatorium microcephalum
is Brickellia reticulata Dr. (Sp. Thake)
I think it is to be kept in Eupato-
rium rather than Ophryosporum.
I will look at others when I
get home. Dr. Gray has
a few good heads, - I send
them.

At Vienna I made
notes on such of Hooker's plants
as I needed, which are there -
- they have only a few, & it
- families published by Presl - Mr
Compton &c. &c.

hear from us from Paris -
