Dear Watson, your letter of  
July 11. (with enclosure of Muller's  
letter, etc.) reached me here, on my  
return at evening from Edinburgh:  
where yesterday I took, let us take  
my last L.D. Aunt Reekie  
favored us with lovely weather - an  
unusual thing in our experience  
and showed off the best it could. It  
is magnificent for site and building  
to match, & was most interesting.

We have only one day more  
& that drawing to a close: by  
tomorrow morning we are off  
like a shot - to join the Horke's  
in Normandy - to be back about  
22<sup>d</sup>, next.

Thanks for all your prints.  
We are here - a little west of  
the Brit. Museum, S. Kensington.  
I dropped in to see if Erythro-  
num revolution, Smith, was to be  
found in Mexico - on Amur,  
which Carruthers recently acquired,  
as you know. C. himself is  
Mr. Britton thought that it  
would have been here this  
laid in to Hutch. if Mexico had  
it. No specimens from him in  
the Hutch. But I bid Britton,  
look through any of Mexico's  
plants not yet laid in, against  
my return here.  
I went also to-day to the

Lincoln, Friday, where Smith's  
plant is present. There is the  
type, no doubt. But Lincoln,  
I say, was a cloud for clear-  
ing - all August!

I expect to be here in
