MIMOSA hispidula.

Little harsh Mimosa.

••••••••

Spec. Char. M. foliis fimplicibus ellipticis obliquis utrinque margineque fcabris, ramulis hifpidopubefcentibus, capitulis folitariis.

Leaves fimple, elliptical, oblique, rough on each fide and at the margin. Young branches clothed with fhort harsh down. Heads of flowers solitary.

A more extraordinary *Mimofa* than even the preceding. We know no other fpecies that has fo much afperity about it; certainly every other fimple-leaved one yet difcovered is perfectly fmooth. It has not appeared in the gardens, nor were any fpecimens fent till last year.

It feems to form a thick rigid bush, the *branches* numerous, alternate, spreading, round, very rough with a short, dense, rigid pubescence, especially when young. *Leaves* alternate, apparently vertical, sessible, elliptical, oblique, pointed, entire, extremely harsh with minute,

prominent, scattered points, especially on the rib and the cartilaginous margin, so that they might be called denticulate. *Stipulæ* in pairs, very minute, triangular, membranous. *Flowers* pale yellow, many together in little round heads, which stand solitary, on rough axillary flower-stalks shorter than the leaves, destitute of bracteæ. Calyx in four segments, ciliated. Petals four, concave-Pod compressed, broadish in proportion to its length.
