THE WHALE SHARK, *RHINIODON TYPUS* SMITH, 1828:  
AN ANNOTATED BIBLIOGRAPHY

(*Selachii Rhiniodontidae*)

**Abstract.** — 345 references on the whale shark, *Rhiniodon typus*, the accessible literature through October 1980, are listed, concisely annotated, and categorized under 19 broad headings.

**Riassunto.** — *Lo Squalo balena, Rhiniodon typus Smith, 1828: bibliografia commentata (Selachii Rhiniodontidae).*

Lo squalo balena, il più grande pesce che si conosca, dalla forma e colorazione inconfondibili, è ampiamente distribuito nella fascia tropicale e temperata calda di tutto il mondo; ciononostante la biologia e la storia naturale di questa specie singolare ci sono quasi totalmente sconosciute. La maggior parte delle notizie in nostro possesso riguarda resoconti di collisioni di questo squalo con barche o navi, oppure di sporadici incontri; a provocare interesse nei suoi confronti hanno contribuito più che altro la drammaticità e la rarità di simili episodi, sì che gran parte della letteratura che lo descrive va considerata giornalistica più che scientifica. Inoltre, molte delle citazioni qui elencate sono totalmente compilative, talvolta ripetizioni, talvolta riassunti di racconti di prima mano. Nel corso della preparazione di questa bibliografia ci ha guidato la speranza di aiutare lo studioso di questa specie a cogliere i contributi scientifici più sostanziali, circumnavigando le numerose fonti irrilevanti o ripetitive.

Malgrado la maggior parte dei 47 articoli firmati da E. W. GUDGER consista in reiterazioni e talvolta inaccurate ricapitolazioni di incontri con squali balena che gli venivano riferiti, sette di questi sono solidi contributi alla conoscenza della specie (citazioni no. 113, 123, 129, 141, 145, 146, 153). Altre eccellenti trattazioni a livello generico sono presentate da BASS *et al.* (15), BIGELOW e SCHROEDER (30), BUDKER (41), CHEVEY (48) e LINEAWEAVER e BACKUS (216). WHITE discute aspetti tassonomico-evolutivi (331). HERRE (179) e McCANN (226) si sforzano in plausibili congetture sulla sua distribuzione. KUTHALINGAM *et al.* descrivono un esemplare in dettaglio (208). PRATER (260) e SILAS e RAJAGOPALAN (278) trattano la presenza dello squalo balena in acque indiane, mentre DERANIYAGALA si occupa della zona riguardante Sri Lanka (Ceylon) (73); il Golfo del Messico è trattato da BAUGHMAN e SPRINGER (20). Esistono

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solo due dettagliate descrizioni anatomiche, una di WHITE (329) e una di DENISON (71). IWASAKI ha compiuto l'unico studio di carattere ecologico (190).

Un cenno ad una questione di sistematica ci pare necessario. Poiché la Commissione Internazionale per la Nomenclatura Zoologica non si è ancora espressa in merito, abbiamo deciso di adottare, per il genere, il termine *Rhiniodon*, in ottemperanza a HUBBS, COMPAGNO e FOLLETT (189), che ne sostennero la precedenza sopra *Rhincodon*, *Rhineodon* e *Rhinodon*. Per differenti pareri in merito vedasi anche PENRITH (251), ROBINS e LEA (268), BROOKE e BASS (342) e SWIFT (343).

La nostra ricerca bibliografica terminò nell'ottobre 1980. E' in preparazione un riassunto ed una discussione delle citazioni qui elencate, accompagnati da carte di distribuzione spaziale e stagionale, basate sulla letteratura.

#### *Nota esplicativa.*

Le citazioni sono state elencate in ordine alfabetico, e numerate.

I seguenti simboli sono stati utilizzati nelle annotazioni:

« NS » = lavoro non esaminato. Segue il numero (o i numeri) riferentesi alla fonte (o fonti) relativa. I commenti contenuti nella fonte sono citati o riassunti in parentesi quadre.

\* = titolo di per sè esplicativo. Eventuali ulteriori informazioni sono contenute nell'annotazione.

Il tipo di trattazione e gli argomenti trattati sono descritti da una o più sigle di due lettere, in calce alla citazione. Segue un elenco delle sigle e delle categorie da esse rappresentate. I numeri corrispondenti alle citazioni appartenenti a ciascuna categoria sono raccolti nella tavola.

#### **Introduction.**

Distinctive markings, a shape that can be confused with that of no other creature on earth, and sheer size make the whale shark spectacular and unmistakable. It is the largest of the fishes, widely distributed throughout warm temperate and tropical seas. Yet practically nothing is known of its natural history or its biology. Reports of collisions with boats or occasional sightings of basking individuals account for most of the little information that we have. Our knowledge thus reflects man's activities and whereabouts more than the realities of the life of the species. The drama of these encounters, and their rarity, has made the whale shark newsworthy, and much of the literature is more representative of journalism than of science.

The problem here is not the commonplace contemporary struggle to keep up with the literature, but rather of wading through it. Since the death in 1956 of that indefatigable chronicler, E. W. GUDGER, no one has kept track of sightings or publications on the whale shark. But, with the increasing popularity of SCUBA diving and underwater photography, the species has become of interest to more than the scientific community. Many of the references cited below are entirely derivative,

repeating or, occasionally, assembling previous accounts. It is our hope to provide the seeker after specific information with the updated record and to guide him around the irrelevant and repetitious material to sources of substance.

Most of the 47 entries authored by E. W. GUDGER are reiterative, often careless rehashes of whale shark encounters that were reported to him, but seven remain solid contributions (reference numbers 113, 123, 129, 141, 145, 146, 153). BUDKER gives an excellent general treatment (41); ELLIS' more popular account is also good (79). Very useful reviews are presented by BASS *et al.* (15), BIGELOW and SCHROEDER (30), CHEVEY (48) and LINEAWEAVER and BACKUS (216). WHITE considers taxonomic-evolutionary relations (331). HERRE (179) and McCANN (226) speculate intelligently on distribution. KUTHALINGAM *et al.* give a finely detailed account of a specimen (208). PRATER (260) and SILAS and RAJAGOPALAN (278) discuss the whale shark in Indian waters in some breadth, DERANIYAGALA treats it in Sri Lanka (73), and the Gulf of Mexico is covered by BAUGHMAN and SPRINGER (20). There are only two detailed anatomical studies, one by WHITE (329), and one by DENISON (71). IWASAKI has made the only ecological study (190).

A word about the systematics of the whale shark is in order. The International Commission on Zoological Nomenclature has yet to hand down a ruling on the familial and generic names, but we have chosen to use *Rhiniodon*, in accordance with the application of HUBBS, COMPAGNO and FOLLETT (189) to that body to establish its priority over *Rhincodon*, *Rhineodon* and *Rhinodon*. PENRITH (251), ROBINS and LEA (268), BROOKE and BASS (342) and SWIFT (343) are also involved in this controversy.

Our literature search was terminated in October 1980. A summary and evaluation of the references listed, accompanied by charts of the geographical and temporal distribution of the whale shark, is in preparation.

Our thanks to Whale Life Research, Ltd., which provided funding for publishing this bibliography, to Hubbs-Sea World Research Institute for aid in its preparation, and to Carl L. Hubbs, that enduring source of inspiration, for his help and encouragement in the last days of his life.

#### **Explanatory note.**

Entries are listed in alphabetical order and numbered.

In the annotations:

« NS » = not seen. The number of the referring source or sources follows. Comment by the source(s) are quoted or summarized within brackets.

\* = self-explanatory title. Any further information is indicated by annotation.

The type of treatment and the material covered are designated by one or more two-letter codes, which follow the entry. The codes and the categories which they represent are given below. The references that fall into each category follow, listed under the category heading by number.

### *Categories*

- AN = *Anecdotal*.
- BH = *Behavior* (excluding feeding behavior); aggressiveness, other interactions with humans; diving, swimming.
- DB = *Distribution*, geographical ranges, seasonality, migration.
- EN = *Environment*, currents, temperatures, depths, water clarity, atmospheric conditions.
- FA = *Faunal Associations* (other than symbiosis).
- FD = *Food and Feeding*; feeding apparatus; feeding behavior; stomach contents.
- FG = *Field Guide/Checklist*, or mere mention.
- FI = *Fishery*; uses by humans; as fish aggregator.
- FL = *Folklore*, myth, superstition, historical reference.
- GB = *General Biology*, physiology, population dynamics, natural history.
- LH = *Life History*, breeding aggregations, the embryo and juvenile specimens; reproduction; sex; sexual maturity; life span.
- MO = *Morphology*, color pattern, skin, teeth, size, internal organs.
- MT = *Measurements* (actual, not estimates).
- OR = *Original Report* of a specimen.
- PL = *Paleontology*.
- PO = *Popular treatment*.
- SB = *Symbiosis*; parasitism, mutualism, commensalism.
- SG = *Sighting* (whether original report, a general discussion of sightings, or a reiterative account).
- TX = *Taxonomy*, evolutionary interrelationships. (Many of these references are of interest only in respect to the synonym used).
