Prize for best student paper in Alytes

In a previous issue of this journal (Afytes, 1996, 13 140), we announced the launching of a prize for the best paper published by a student in Afytes. We are glad to announce the first awarding of this prize, for papers published since then in Afytes. No paper published in volumes 14 and 15 of Afytes was proposed for this prize, but three student papers were proposed for volume 16. Two of these papers came out as tied winners, and the ISSCA Board decided to offer the prize to the authors of both: for each of these two papers, ISSCA is glad to offer a complete collection of Afytes from volume 1 (1982) to volume 16 (1998-1999). The two prize-winning papers are (by alphabetical order of first author):

Anne M. Maglia. - The adult skeleton of Spea multiplicata and a comparison of the osteology of the pelobatid frogs. Alytes, 1999, 16 (3-4); 148-164.

Ana Eugenia RESTREPO & Julio Mario Hoyos. – Musculatura de los miembros y de las cinturas en Bolitolgolssa adspersa (Peters, 1863) (Urodela, Plethodontidae). Alytes, 1998, 16 (1-2): 25-49.

From now on, the prize is open again for competition. To be eligible for this prize, a paper should be authored by a student alone or by several students, but should not be a multi-author paper by student(s) and non-student(s). Studentship should be attested by an administrative document or by a letter from the student's professor or supervisor. Candidacy to this prize should be indicated by the student when returning the corrected proofs of her/his accepted paper to the chief-editor of Alytes. The choice of the winning paper will be made by the ISSCA Baard.
