

A New Subspecies of *Cacoplia nebulosa* (Hald.) (Coleoptera: Cerambycidae)

The following form appears to be at the edge of the known distribution of *Cacoplia nebulosa nebulosa* (Hald.) and differs sufficiently to warrant a subspecific name.

Cacoplia nebulosa albata n. subsp.

Size and form of a large *C. nebulosa nebulosa* (Hald.). Background throughout blackish brown which gives the insect appearance of a black ground color. Clothed with short recumbent gray pubescence on both surfaces. Antennae annulate from third to tenth segments inclusive.

Length 13.5 mm.; width 3.6 mm.

Holotype male labeled Mobile, ALABAMA, May 25, 1952, W. Rosenberg collector, in collection of author.

Superficially this subspecies resembles *Saperda inornata* Say, however, it is larger and longer. It can easily be separated by its dark ground color from *C. nebulosa nebulosa*, which has a light brown background throughout.
