I may not be improper to transcribe Mr. Ellis's account of this production.

"This fea mat is formed of fand and flime into a cruftaceous body, with fmall mouths placed almost in a quincunx order."

"This was fent me from Holyhead in Wales. Its form, when intire, was exactly like the upper femicircular part of a colt's hoof. The furface of each of the cells was a little hollow in the middle, with a finall hole in each. From the appearance it made when I received it intire, I judged it to be what Imperatus calls his *Lorica marina.*—There is a layer of fand and flime under as well as over
