THE GENERIC NAME "INVESTIGATOR": A CORRECTION.

Since the publication of my memoir "Investigator sicarius, a Gephyrean worm hitherto undescribed, the type of a new order" (Memoirs of the Indian Museum, vol. i, No. 4, 1909), the fact has been brought to my notice that the name "Investigator" has already been appropriated. Goode and Bean in 1895 separated the species Nemichthys acanthonotus, Alcock, from the genus Nemichthys, and bestowed the name Investigator upon the new genus thus formed (Goode and Bean, Oceanic Ichthyology, p. 518). It may be noted that Alcock has not accepted this alteration (Alcock, Descriptive Catalogue of the Indian Deep-Sea Fishes, Calcutta, 1899). It is, however, necessary to find another name for the Gephyrean genus Investigator, and I therefore propose the Greek form of the same word, namely, Ereunetes.

Thus for Order Investigatoroidea read Order Ereunetoidea; for Genus Investigator read Genus Ereunetes; type Ereunetes sicarius.
