**The Black Cat (1895-1922) was a monthly literary magazine, publishing original short stories, often about uncanny or fantastical topics. Many writers were largely unknown, but some famous authors also wrote original material for this magazine.**

**The first issue of Volume 4 sported the following stories:**

- > **The Lost Jurisdiction, by Ellis Meredith: witness a spectacular court trial over life and death**
- > **Jim Crow - Detective, by Stanley Edwards Johnson: a crow involuntarily helps the police solve a crime**
- > **Jugganath's Ring, by W. A. Fraser: who really stole that cursed ring ?**
- > **Long Brown of Esmeralda, by Arthur McEwen: learn about a gambler's way of helping two lovers**
- > **The Passing of Cesare, by Helen Pitkin: a coquettish girl finally realizes she has flirted with one man too many**
- > **The Crowning Moment, by May McHenry: the story of a man's honourable final deed**
