

## PURPOSE

The purpose of the Art Association is first and foremost educational. As a joint undertaking it proposes to help foster the lively interest in art noticeable in Town and College, as one means of enriching the life of our whole community, and particularly of awakening and encouraging the creative talent that may exist among our younger people and which might otherwise come to nothing. This work, like that of every educational enterprise, will be slow, but, let us hope, proportionately sure.

The Association is proceeding on the assumption that the only way to cultivate good taste in art is to study objects of art frequently, seriously, and at leisure. With this in view it plans to bring to Lynchburg, at the lowest practicable cost, as many exhibitions of oil paintings, water colors, sculpture, etc., as possible each year, and to make these exhibitions accessible to its members for a reasonable length of time. It will also provide for appropriate lectures to be given by competent speakers in connection with the exhibitions.

In addition to this annual program, the Art Association wishes to encourage the gradual assembling of a permanent exhibition of paintings, and to this end, when its Executive Committee may decide that the program of the year has been sufficiently maintained, it may oppropriate any surplus funds to aid the College in adding to the collection already so well begun there, on condition that this permanent exhibition will be open at all times to the Lynchburg public.

### **EXHIBITIONS**

The first major exhibition will be a collection of water colors from the New York Water Color Club, and will be on display from February 7-16 inclusive. Henry B. Snell, President, has been engaged to lecture on this collection on February 7th.

It is to be understood that a season membership card entitles the holder to one major and to at least two minor exhibitions.
