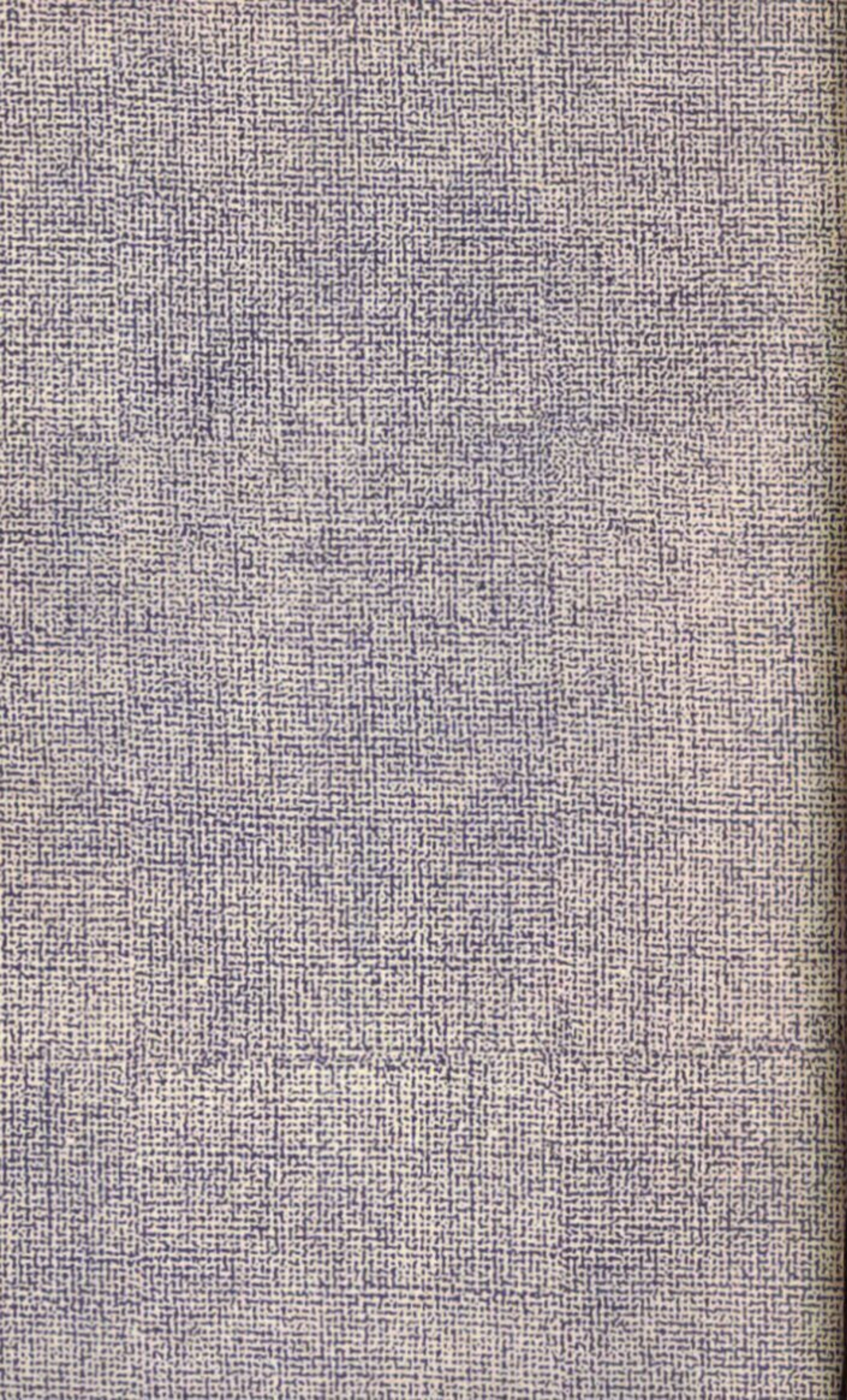

First published in 1798, this book by Professor John Robison, is a scholarly study of Adam Weishaupt's Illuminati Order formed in 1776. This conspiratorial organization, as Professor Robison reveals, embodied all of the goals, aims, and methods of what we now call Communism.

THE INVISIBLE GOVERNMENT* 1.00

This fully documented study of the Council on Foreign Relations shows how that organization influences American foreign and domestic policy to further its aim of converting the American Republic into a dependent unit in a one-world socialist system.

THE ACTOR 1.00

The true story of John Foster Dulles, Secretary of State 1953-1959. This book abounds with hard evidence that John Foster Dulles played a dual role: one as an actor posing as a "conservative, Republican anti-Communist," the other, the real Dulles, zealous for a world Communist state.

This history of the founding of the Republic of Panama focuses on the role of the United States in the establishment of that small country and on our sovereign rights over the Panama Canal Zone.

Johnson: COLOR, COMMUNISM AND COMMON SENSE50

Manning Johnson, a Negro who was for ten years an ardent member of the Communist Party, exposes the Party's cruel deception of American Negroes and shows how the civil rights movement will eventually benefit the Communists.

Oliver: INTRODUCTION TO THE CONTEMPORARY HISTORY OF LATIN AMERICA50

Beginning with a study of the early inhabitants of Latin America and the European colonization in that area, this short book examines the culture, economics, politics and Communist influences in Latin American countries.

Sturdza: WORLD GOVERNMENT AND INTERNATIONAL ASSASSINATION 1.00

This small but devastating indictment of the United Nations, written by a former foreign minister of Romania, charges that organization with premeditated aggression in Katanga.
