## FOREWORD

The New England History Teachers' Association was founded in the spring of 1897. Its organization resulted from an invitation, by the members of the Conference on College Entrance Requirements in History, appointed by the New England Association of College and Preparatory Schools, issued Pto a number of teachers of history and school principals requesting their presence at a preliminary meeting "to consider the advisability of forming a permanent organization of teachers of history and government." Mr. Ray G. Huling, Head Master of the Cambridge English High School, presided at the preliminary meeting. In the spring of 1898, a constitution was adopted and an election of officers held with the following results; President, Edwin A. Start of Tufts College, Vice-President, Anna B. Thompson of Thayer Academy, Secretary, A. P. Walker of the English High School, Boston, Additional Council Members, Albert B. Hart of Harvard University, Edward G. Bourne of Yale University, Mary E. Whipple of the English High School, Worcester, Frederick Winsor of Phillips Exeter Academy.

The purpose of the Association as stated in its constitution, "is the advancement of the study of history, government, and economics by the discussion and dissemina-

tion of ideas and by the promotion of social relations among teachers of these subjects in the schools and colleges of New England."

For the furtherance of these ends, the Association holds a spring and a fall meeting each year. At these meetings, papers are read and discussed and committee reports are considered. Following the meetings, a luncheon is held at which the members are addressed on some subject of professional interest. Meetings have been held in Boston, Worcester, Springfield, Portland, Providence and elsewhere.

Much of the good work of the Association is done by committees the result of whose labor is frequently published. Following is a partial list of the publications of the Association.

## **BY-LAWS**

(The New England History Teachers' Association was incorporated under the laws of Massachusetts in 1911.)

# ARTICLE I NAME AND PURPOSE

This Association shall be known as the New England History Teachers' Association. Its purpose is the advancement of the study of history, government and economics, by the discussion and dissemination of ideas, and by the promotion of social relations among teachers of these subjects in the schools and colleges of New England.

# ARTICLE II

Any teacher of history, government, or economics in a New England school or col-

lege is eligible to active membership.

Any other school or college official may be elected to associate membership, on recommendation of the Council, by a twothirds vote of the members present at any regular meeting.

Associate members are entitled to all the privileges of active members, except the right to vote and to hold office. They are

not subject to assessment.

Applications for active membership, indorsed by a member of the Association, shall be submitted in writing to the Secretary, and shall be accepted or rejected by a vote of the Council at the meeting following the receipt of the application.

# ARTICLE III OFFICERS

The officers shall be a President, a Vice-President, and a Secretary (who shall act as Treasurer), who with four others, shall constitute the Council, in which is vested the general direction of the affairs of the Association. The term of the officers shall be one year.

At the annual meeting in October, 1911, two members of the Council shall be elected for a term of two years, by ballot, and two members for a term of one year. At each annual Fall meeting thereafter, two members shall be elected by ballot to be members of the Council for two years.

All officers shall be chosen by ballot.

The Council shall appoint, at its first meeting in each year, the following Stand-ing Committees: on Text-Books, of seven members; on Courses of Study, of five members; on Historical Materials, of five members; on College Entrance Requirements, of five members; together with any other committees that the Association may

order

# ARTICLE IV MEETINGS

Unless otherwise ordered by the vote of two-thirds of the Council, regular meetings of the Association shall be held on the third Saturday in October and April at such place in New England as the Council shall appoint. Special meetings may be called by the Council at its discretion. The election of officers shall take place at the Fall meeting.

# ARTICLE V

The annual membership fee shall be one dollar, payable at the October meeting. Additional assessments to meet expenses may be levied by the Council.

# ARTICLE VI AMENDMENTS

These by-laws may be amended at any regular meeting by a two-thirds vote of those present, notice of the proposed amendment having been given in the call for the meeting.

# AMENDMENT (PASSED OCT. 18, 1913)

The fiscal year of the Association shall extend from October first to September thirtieth inclusive. The accounts of the Treasurer shall be audited annually by a person appointed by the Council for that purpose. The same person shall not act as auditor in two successive years.
