## Preface

This is a guide to published official records of Botswana, Lesotho, and Swaziland from 1868 to 1968. Neither date was selected arbitrarily. From 1868 published official records issued by or on behalf of Basutoland (Lesotho), the first of the High Commission Territories, may be identified. One hundred years later, the independence of Swaziland, the last of the High Commission Territories, signaled the end of effective British rule in continental Africa.

This bibliography includes citations to documents of the former High Commission Territories during British protection and since independence, together with reports prepared by agencies or individuals with official authorization and funds. From 1868 to the beginning of the 20th century, official publications issued by the three governments are sparse. To increase the usefulness of the guide for this period, a number of relevant British official papers have been included, some of which pertain to Bechuanaland (Botswana) and Swaziland before the establishment of British protectorates. These papers are of significance because they contribute to an understanding of each territory's subsequent relations with the protecting power. There is also a selection of publications issued by the Colony of the Cape of Good Hope, which administered Basutoland from 1871 to 1884, and the South African Republic and Transvaal Colony which had some jurisdiction over Swaziland from 1894 to 1899 and 1903 to 1906.

A number of official publications of the governments of the Union and the Republic of South Africa are relevant to the study of the former High Commission Territories, for example in the fields of banking and currency, customs, transportation, statistics, and postal and telecommunications services. These documents have been excluded, however, because they were not prepared by or subject to the authority of the governments of the three countries. Reports prepared by specialized agencies of the United Nations have also been excluded.

The guide is divided into nine parts which include separate sections for Botswana and Lesotho under their earlier names, Bechuanaland and Basutoland, and a brief section of works by or about the High Commission Territories collectively. Entries are arranged alphabetically by author and title within each part except that publications concerning censuses, constitutions, development plans and planning, estimates, laws, and legislatures have been grouped together under these headings. The subdivision "Other Publications" at the end of some parts includes official and quasi-official documents cataloged by American libraries or found in bibliographies entered under personal or corporate authors. There is also an index, mainly to subjects and personal authors.

Every effort has been made to identify the significant publications issued by or on behalf of the former High Commission Territories. The emphasis has been on locating copies held by the Library of Congress and other American libraries represented in the National Union Catalog. Location of items is indicated either by a Library of Congress call number or location symbol or, for material in another library, by the National Union Catalog symbol for the library (see "Key to Symbols"). Information about titles not located in American libraries has been gathered primarily from bibliographic sources such as the *Catalogue* of the Colonial Office Library and the Royal Commonwealth Society's *Catalogue*. Also important for providing leads to government publications were the

annual reports on Basotland, Bechuanaland, and Swaziland issued by the British Government (see complete citations in “Key to Sources Quoted”), and part 5 of Lord Hailey’s *Native Administration in the British African Territories* (item 776 in the bibliography).

Several publications that were identified after the bibliography was numbered have been inserted in their appropriate sections and sequences and assigned the number of the preceding entry followed by an “a” or “b”.

## Historical Note

Botswana, Lesotho, and Swaziland share a unique and sometimes uneasy experience as independent black African countries in the midst of European-controlled southern Africa. Their emergence as autonomous states reflects, in part, the thrust of African nationalism in the 1960's which changed the political map of Africa. It also reflects the historical and political circumstances which influenced the British Government's decisions, between 1909 and 1961, to postpone transferring the High Commission Territories to the jurisdiction of the Union of South Africa. When South Africa became a Republic in 1961 and withdrew from the British Commonwealth because of challenges to its controversial racial policies, the prospect of any future transfer of Basutoland, Bechuanaland, or Swaziland to South Africa declined. This was a turning point in the affairs of the people of the High Commission Territories, after which their political aspirations gained momentum and, eventually, recognition.

### Lesotho

Basutoland, the first of the High Commission Territories in southern Africa, became the independent Kingdom of Lesotho on October 4, 1966. This enclave of 11,716 square miles, situated within the Republic of South Africa, is the home of almost a million people, the majority of whom claim descent from the Sotho clans which were unified in the early 19th century under Moshoeshe I. During the wars of conquest waged at that time by the Zulu and Matabele in southern Africa, Moshoeshe succeeded in rallying the Basuto to resist subjugation and to extend their territorial claims.

By the 1850's, Dutch farmers, who had migrated from the Cape Colony to the vicinity of the Basuto, were making incursions into areas which the latter considered theirs. Raids and retaliatory expeditions by the two groups multiplied, culminating in warfare. After repeated requests for assistance, Moshoeshe obtained the intervention of the British High Commissioner in South Africa who extended British

protection by annexing Basutoland on March 12, 1868. A year later the boundaries between Basutoland and the Boer's Orange Free State were delimited by the Convention of Aliwal North and, although neither side was satisfied with the provisions of the settlement, their boundaries have remained essentially the same to the present.

In 1871 Basutoland was annexed to the British Colony of the Cape of Good Hope. This arrangement lasted 13 turbulent years, marked by growing resentment among the Basuto against the Cape government's attempts to regulate their internal affairs. Warfare broke out in 1880 when the government tried to enforce a policy of disarming the African population. After the settlement of the "Gun War" by arbitration in 1881, the Cape Colony initiated negotiations aimed at returning Basutoland to Britain's authority, and in 1884 Basutoland was restored to the British Crown under the jurisdiction of the High Commissioner. The Cape Colony continued to contribute to the cost of administering the territory, however, until early in the 20th century.

The local representative of the High Commissioner was the Resident Commissioner who served as principal executive officer of Basutoland and president of the Basutoland Council. The Council, an advisory body composed mainly of chiefs' representatives and official members, received statutory recognition in 1910. Beginning in 1938, however, a number of proclamations were issued which signaled a change in British policy. Chiefs and their courts of law were subject to new rules of conduct, district councils were created to provide a means of communication between the people and the Basutoland Council, a national treasury was established to provide salaries for chiefs commensurate with their functions, and the number of chiefs and courts was reduced. Provisions were made subsequently for the nomination and election of representatives of the people to the Basutoland Council.

In 1955 the Council recommended that it be granted legislative authority in matters concerning internal affairs. A committee appointed to investigate



this question and related problems issued its report in 1958, followed by the drafting of a constitution for Basutoland which became effective in 1960. This constitution established an Executive Council and a legislature, the Basutoland National Council, half of whose members were elected indirectly by the people. The election for representatives to the legislature provided the forum for political parties to raise a number of important questions, particularly concerning self-government and Basutoland's relations with South Africa.

Responding to demands for constitutional review and greater autonomy, in 1963 a Constitutional Commission presented its report which included a timetable for eventual independence. Negotiations in London between Basuto and British officials were followed by the promulgation of a new constitution in 1965 providing for internal self-government. A slightly modified version of this document was adopted as the independence constitution under which Basutoland became the Kingdom of Lesotho on October 4, 1966, with Moshoeshoe II as constitutional monarch and Chief Leabua Jonathan as Prime Minister.

## Botswana

Botswana, a country of 220,000 square miles, is the largest of the former High Commission Territories and the only one of the three states which claims geographic contact with another independent black state—Zambia. The Batswana, who constitute the majority of Botswana's estimated population of 593,000, are believed to have a common or related ancestry. By the 19th century the principal Batswana groups had migrated into their present location from central and eastern Africa, dispersing the aboriginal "bushmen" on the way. Khama III, a principal Batswana chief, rose to prominence in the 1870's by successfully resisting incursions by the neighboring Matabele. Later, when the Boers attempted to claim large areas of Batswana territory, Khama sought British assistance. Great Britain complied by establishing a protectorate over Khama's country and over the territory of several other Batswana chiefs in 1885. The southern part of the annexed territory was proclaimed the Crown Colony of British Bechuanaland and was incorporated in the Cape Colony in 1895. That year Khama and two other chiefs traveled to England to negotiate an arrangement which would exempt their lands from transfer to the administrative

jurisdiction of the British South Africa Company, a move then contemplated by the British Government. A compromise agreement was reached providing for the chiefs to cede strips of land to the British South Africa Company for passage of the Bechuanaland (later Rhodesia) Railway. In exchange, their territories would remain British protectorates under the jurisdiction of the High Commissioner.

The Order in Council of 1891 that first established the authority of the High Commissioner over the Bechuanaland Protectorate also contained provisions for the protection of African customary law. Using this as a basis for administrative policies, the British made little attempt to regulate the internal affairs of the various Batswana groups for the next four decades. Beginning in 1934, however, the administration enacted proclamations restricting the authority of the chiefs and establishing greater control over local affairs.

The Protectorate's legislature evolved from separate advisory councils representing African and European interests which were established in 1920. In 1950 a Joint Advisory Council was created which enabled the two groups to work together. Eleven years later, the Council's Constitutional Committee drafted a constitution providing for advisory Executive and African Councils and a Legislative Council with limited responsibility for drafting legislation.

The disproportionately high representation of the territory's small European population in the Protectorate's first legislature brought demands from African leaders for reform and greater autonomy. By 1965, after more than two years of negotiations, a new constitution was promulgated establishing a form of self-government. It created a popularly elected nonracial Legislative Assembly from which a Prime Minister would be elected. That same year, the capital of Bechuanaland was moved from Mafeking in South Africa, where it had been located since the 19th century, to Gaborone in the Protectorate.

In 1966 representatives of the new Bechuanaland Government met with British officials in London to discuss independence. It was agreed that the office of Prime Minister would be replaced by that of President, and legislative power would be vested in the President and the National Assembly. The composition and functions of the House of Chiefs, which had been set forth in the pre-independence constitution, were slightly modified, and a new constitution was approved. On September 30, 1966, Bechuanaland became the independent Republic of Botswana with Sir Seretse Khama as the first President.



## Swaziland

Swaziland, with 6,705 square miles and 374,697 inhabitants, is the smallest of the former High Commission Territories, but it has the most promising land and mineral resources. Although Swaziland was the last of the territories to regain its independence, its people maintain that they were never a subject nation despite British rule. The Swazi are believed to have migrated into their present locations in Swaziland and Eastern Transvaal during the 18th century, strengthening their own group by marrying into or absorbing neighboring populations. During the reign of Mswati, 1840-68, the Swazi developed a strong fighting force which enabled them to extend their territorial claims, despite the ever-present threat of the Zulus to the south. The most serious challenge to the Swazi's sovereignty, however, was to come from Europeans who were attracted by Swaziland's minerals and the generous concessions awarded by its kings.

As early as the 1860's land concessions were granted to Boer settlers. During the 1870's and 1880's, there was an influx of Boer and British settlers and adventurers seeking land and mineral concessions, grazing and trading rights, and other special dispensations. When conflicts among the Europeans occurred because of overlapping claims, the South African Republic (Transvaal) and the British Government intervened in 1890 to establish a form of condominium government. In the Swaziland Convention of 1890 which created this government, the independence of the Swazi was guaranteed, in keeping with guarantees contained in earlier agreements between the Boers and the British in 1881 and 1884. Three years later, however, the South African Republic obtained the consent of the British Government to negotiate with the Swazi for control of Swaziland, although not for its incorporation. Despite the Swazi's refusals to agree to these demands, in 1894 the South African Republic and Great Britain concluded a new convention conferring jurisdiction over Swaziland upon the Republic. Five years later, with the outbreak of the Anglo-Boer War, the South African Republic relinquished control of the country to the Swazi Paramount Chief.

Following the defeat of the South African Republic, Great Britain annexed the Republic (renamed Transvaal Colony) and Swaziland as well, claiming inheritance of the Republic's jurisdiction over Swaziland as a result of Britain's victory. Swaziland was administered briefly by a Special Commissioner until

the Governor of the Transvaal Colony assumed control of the territory in 1903. When the Transvaal received self-government in 1906, Swaziland was transferred to the jurisdiction of the High Commissioner for South Africa, and a Resident Commissioner was appointed to represent him.

Among the most serious problems facing the new Swaziland administration was the question of land concessions and the shortage of available land for the Swazi. By proclamation in 1908, one third of each land concession, excluding mineral areas and land set aside for the Crown, was partitioned for the use of the Swazi. The result was that the people who comprised at least 90 percent of the population were allocated less than 30 percent of the land. The Swazi maintained that complete alienation of the land to European concessionaires had never been the intention of their kings, because such a concept was completely foreign to Swazi law and custom. The land question remained controversial throughout the course of British rule, and, as recently as 1968, Swazi delegates to the Independence Conference in London suggested that there should be compensation for their lost patrimony.

Regular meetings between the British officials and the Swazi King and lesser chiefs were initiated in the late 1920's, but responsibility for the Swazi's internal affairs was left largely in the hands of the latter. Regulations governing the Swazi chieftaincy were initiated in 1944 but did not actually become operative until 1950. The small but influential European community in Swaziland was represented by a European Advisory Council, established in 1921 and receiving statutory recognition in 1949, which advised the Resident Commissioner on matters affecting their interests.

In 1960 a committee was appointed by the Resident Commissioner to formulate proposals for a bi-racial council to advise and help draft legislation for Swaziland. The committee's report, together with modifications introduced by the British Government, created the framework for a constitution which was promulgated in 1963. This constitution established an Executive Council of official and nonofficial members and a Legislative Council formed in part of representatives elected on a basis of racial parity. The election for African representatives to the legislature took place in 1964. Although it was contested by a number of political parties that had surfaced during the previous four years, all seats were won by the Mbokodvo National Movement supported by the Swazi chieftaincy.

At the first meeting of the new legislature, the leader of the African representatives raised the question of constitutional review. Talks began in 1965 during which the British Government agreed to recognize the Swazi King, Sobhuza II, as head of a protected state with internal self-government, except in a few areas such as finance, security, and the public service. A bicameral Parliament consisting of a non-racial House of Assembly and a Senate was also proposed. Only on the question of the King's control of minerals was there substantial disagreement. The pre-independence constitution came into effect on April 25, 1967. Elections for the House of Assembly took place earlier in the month and resulted in

another victory for the Mbokodvo National Movement led by Prince Makhosini Dlamini.

In September 1967 the Swaziland Parliament unanimously agreed to initiate independence proceedings with the British Government. Talks held in London the following year resulted in the drafting of an independence constitution similar in many ways to the previous constitution except that the King gained control of mineral rights which had previously been denied him. On September 6, 1968, Swaziland became an independent kingdom, thus concluding the colonial history of the High Commission Territories in southern Africa.

### LEGISLATIVE AND ADVISORY COUNCILS (items 97-103)

Note: The advisory Basutoland Council, variously called Basutoland National Council and Basuto National Council, began meeting regularly in 1903 and received statutory recognition 7 years later. The Basutoland Constitution of 1960 provided for a new National Council with legislative responsibility in a number of areas relating to internal affairs. An advisory Executive Council, with some responsibility for activities of the departments of government, was also created at this time. In 1965 a new bicameral legislature was established, according to provisions of the pre-independence constitution. ## LEGISLATIVE AND ADVISORY COUNCILS (items 252-67)

Note: In 1920, statutory Native and European Advisory Councils were established to advise the Resident Commissioner on matters affecting the African and European populations. The Native (later African) Advisory Council was composed of government officials, chiefs and other African representatives, while the European Advisory Council was elected by the European population. A Joint Advisory Council was formed in 1950 consisting of representatives of the two Councils and officials. This advisory body was given some responsibilities for drafting legislation. In 1960, a new constitution, based on proposals drafted by the Joint Advisory Council's Constitutional Committee, became effective. The constitution provided for a Legislative Council composed of Africans, Europeans, and an Asian representative, the latter two being popularly elected by their constituents. African representatives were nominated by an African Council, which also served as a consultative body on African affairs. An advisory Executive Council was established. The pre-independence constitution, which became effective in 1965, created a Legislative Assembly, the majority of members of which were popularly elected. A Prime Minister was to be chosen from the Legislative Assembly through elections in the Assembly. A consultative House of Chiefs was established to advise on legislation affecting traditional affairs (*see also* item 232).

### CONSTITUTION (items 392-98)

Note: In 1962, a Constitutional Committee that had been appointed by the Resident Commissioner of Swaziland two years earlier submitted its report. The Committee's recommendations and proposals suggested by the Secretary of State provided a framework for discussions which led to the drafting of a constitution for Swaziland in 1963. At the first meeting of the legislature created by the new constitution, a committee to review that constitution was proposed. This committee was established in 1965, and its report was submitted the next year. Consultations between British authorities and various interest groups in Swaziland ensued and resulted in the drafting of another constitution in 1967. This pre-independence constitution contained many provisions that were retained in the independence constitution that was negotiated the next year during talks in London. The independence constitution became effective as of September 6, 1968.

## LEGISLATIVE AND ADVISORY COUNCILS (items 490-95)

Note: In June 1964 representatives of the Swazi and European populations were elected to seats in a Legislative Council from African, European, and national rolls, as provided for in the constitution of 1963. Prior to this election, separate Swazi and European councils were in existence and had served as advisory bodies to the Resident Commissioner for discussion of problems and proposed legislation which might affect their respective groups. An Executive Council was also formed in 1964 consisting of representatives from the Legislative Council and appointees of the Queen's Commissioner. The Legislative Council was succeeded in 1967 by a bicameral Parliament comprised of a House of Assembly and a Senate. The House of Assembly, elected without regard to special racial provisions, consisted of representatives directly elected by the voters from eight three-member constituencies, together with the Attorney-General and a specified number of nominees of the King. The Senate was composed of an equal number of representatives chosen by the House of Assembly and by the King. The structure of the Swaziland parliament remained essentially the same according to the provisions of the independence constitution in 1968.

## Cape of Good Hope

*Note: By an Act of the legislature of the Colony of the Cape of Good Hope, Basutoland was annexed to the Colony in 1871. Thirteen years later the Cape Colony's jurisdiction over Basutoland was relinquished to the British Government. Responsibility for Basutoland's administration devolved upon the British High Commissioner for South Africa who, until the end of the 19th century was also Governor of the Cape Colony. A Resident Commissioner was stationed in Basutoland to administer the territory on behalf of the High Commissioner.*

When South Africa became a Republic outside the British Commonwealth in 1961, Great Britain's relations with South Africa were transferred to the jurisdiction of the Foreign Office, while the High Commission Territories were restored to the jurisdiction of the Colonial Office.

Note: The office and functions of the High Commissioner evolved from the commission to the Governor of the Cape Colony in 1846 appointing him “High Commissioner for the settling and adjustment of the affairs of the territories in Southern Africa adjacent or contiguous to the eastern and northeastern frontier of the said Colony.” (Cited in the Dominions Office and Colonial Office List of Great Britain, 1940, p. 213). The Commissioner’s authority in Basutoland was established by Order in Council of February 2, 1884. Orders in Council dated May 9, 1891, and December 1, 1906, respectively, established his authority in Bechuanaland Protectorate and Swaziland. In each of the territories, Great Britain’s suzerainty had been proclaimed considerably earlier.

Until the end of the 19th century, the Governor of the Cape Colony served also as High Commissioner. From 1900 to 1964, the Commissionership was held successively by the Administrator, then Governor, of the Transvaal and the Orange River Colony, the Governor General of the Union of South Africa, the High Commissioner of

the United Kingdom in South Africa, and the British Ambassador to South Africa. In 1935 the Commissioner’s official title was changed from High Commissioner for South Africa to High Commissioner for Basutoland, the Bechuanaland Protectorate, and Swaziland.

Between 1963 and 1964, constitutional and administrative changes in the Territories resulted in their removal from the direct authority of the High Commissioner. His local representatives, the Resident Commissioners, were replaced by Commissioners who reported directly to the Secretary of State for the Colonies. By an Order in Council dated July 27, 1964, the office of High Commissioner was abolished.

## South African Republic and Transvaal Colony

*Note: The Swaziland Convention of 1890 established a government commission composed of representatives of Great Britain and the South African Republic and a European representative of the Swazi to regulate the affairs of Swaziland. The internal affairs of the Swazi were exempted from the jurisdiction of the commission. In 1894, the South African Republic, having obtained Britain's consent, became the sole administering authority in Swaziland despite the Swazi's refusal to assent to this change. From 1894 to 1899 the South African Republic exercised the "rights and powers of jurisdiction, protection and administration" in Swaziland; however, with the outbreak of the Anglo-Boer War, the Republic relinquished control of Swaziland to the Swazi Paramount Chief.*

*When Britain defeated and annexed the South African Republic (renamed Transvaal Colony), Swaziland was also annexed. In 1903 the Governor of Transvaal Colony was formally empowered to administer Swaziland. Three years later, when the Transvaal was granted self-government, the Governor's jurisdiction over Swaziland was transferred to the High Commissioner for South Africa.*

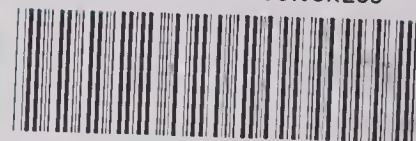
